The ..... is opposite the .....

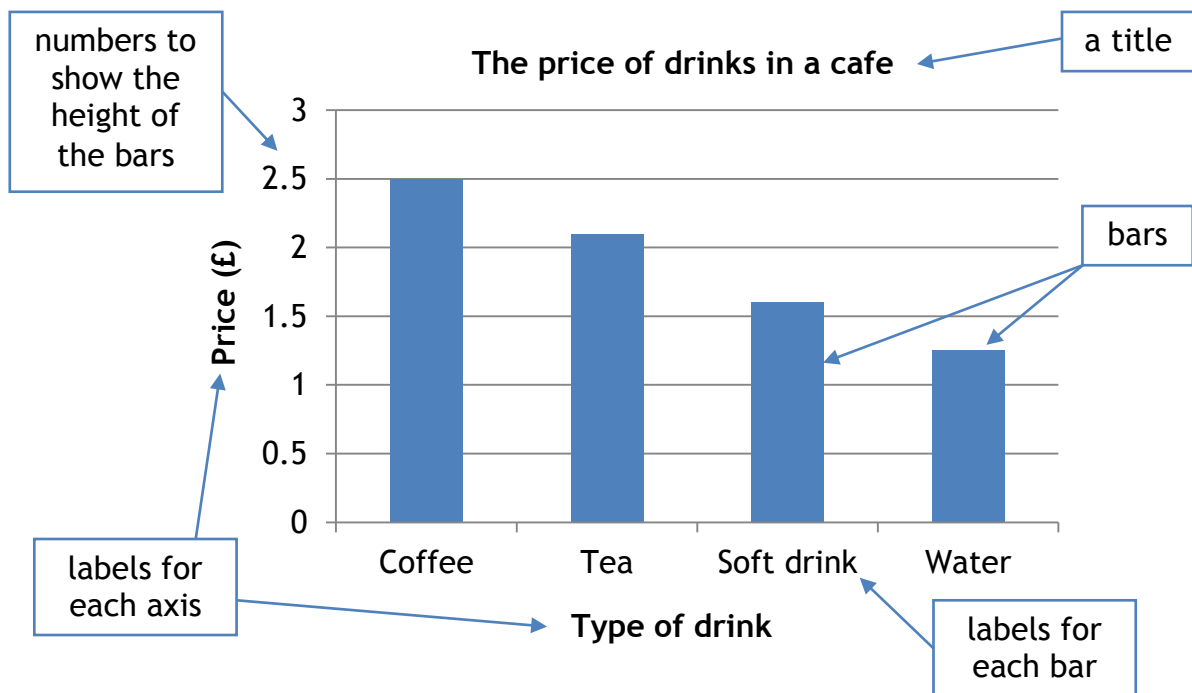
The ..... is on the left/right of the door.
